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
How some people reacted just after the old days and when they first found a virus ...

My Own Good Answer

-To raise children's awareness of the problems associated with drugs, alcohol and violence

- Why not make some additions: To make children aware of the dangers that reside on the internet





Together with some MEGA officers and some school teachers we created a set of basic security related questions for children (age 11-12)....

=> Let's have a look together to some of the results...





Let's go to the children (age 11-12)...





Question 1: Do you know what a computer virus is?

Some answers: "No" "It eats your emails" "It wipes out everything" "The computer is sick"



Question 2: Have you ever been infected by a computer virus?

Some answers: 20% said "yes" 10% said "no" 70% said "I don't know"



Question 3: What are the effects of a virus?

Some answers: See answer 1, however it became clear that only a few children really seems to know what viruses exactly do – none of them mentioned self-replication...



Question 4: Do you click on every link in an email and open every attachment you receive?

Some answers: 99% said "yes"



Question 5: Do you use 'easy' passwords?

Some answers: 80% blank passwords if possible 16% easy password (they found it difficult) 4% difficult password



Question 6: How can I surf on the internet safely?

Some answers: "I surf to kids' sites" [laughing] "Isn't the internet safe?!" "I use Google" "I have an anti-virus program, it was delivered with the pc for free" (Note: 3 trial months...)



Question 7: What do you think of viruswriting or hacking?

Some answers: "Cool" "Dangerous for your health" "Oh my father does it all the time..."





Conclusions and opinions in Belgium ?

- I wrote an article about it in August VB 2004
- It was not a scientific poll yet, but it reflected the ideas of some children in one region in the world...
- Children of that age don't seem to know very well what computer security is!
- We must start ethical computer education at a much earlier age, if we want to change people's behaviour and reduce the attractiveness of becoming a virus-writer, hacker or spyware-writer.
- We could incorporate this information inside the projects like MEGA/DARE
- Bringing in more psychological elements and Re-evaluation next year
- Investigate if this can be done elsewhere .. worldwide?
